# DATA PRIVACY NOTICE

# **ReSource for Anglican Renewal Ministries**

## 1. Your personal data – what is it?

Personal data relates to a living individual who can be identified from that data. Identification can be by the information alone or in conjunction with any other information in the data controller's possession or likely to come into such possession. With effect from 25 May 2018 the processing of personal data will be governed by the General Data Protection Regulation (the 'GDPR').



#### 2. Who are we?

ReSource is the data controller (contact details below). This means that we decide how your personal data is processed and for what purposes.

#### 3. How do we process your personal data?

ReSource complies with its obligations under the 'GDPR' by keeping personal data up to date; by storing and destroying it securely; B not collecting or retaining excessive amounts of data; by protecting personal data from loss, misuse, unauthorised access and disclosure and by ensuring that appropriate technical measures are in place to protect personal data.

We will use your personal data for the following purposes: -

- To administer supporter records;
- To fundraise and promote the interests of the charity;
- To manage our employees and volunteers;
- To maintain our own accounts and records (including the processing of gift aid applications);
- To inform you of the news, events and activities of ReSource;
- To share your contact details with ReSource staff, consultants and volunteers, ReSource Ministers and trustees.

#### 4. What is the legal basis for our processing of your personal data?

- Explicit consent of the data subject so that we can keep you informed about news, events and activities and process your gift aid donations and payments for services and products.
- In the case of volunteers and employees, processing is necessary for carrying out obligations under employment, social security or social protection law, or a collective agreement;
- Processing is carried out by a not-for-profit body with a political, philosophical, religious or trade union aim provided: -
  - I. the processing relates only to members or former members (or those who have regular contact with it in connection with those purposes); and
  - II. disclosure to third parties only where the relationship is governed by a written contract which covers GDPR obligations (such as our database provider, our auditors or accountants, our software provider for online registrations and emailing) is limited to where it is required for the purposes for which data has been provided.

#### 5. Sharing your personal data

Your personal data will be treated as strictly confidential and will only be shared with staff, consultants and volunteers, ReSource Ministers and the trustees of ReSource in order to carry out our ministry. We will only ever share your data with other third parties outside of ReSource with your consent.

#### 6. How long do we keep your personal data?

We keep data in accordance with the guidance set out in Clause 10 of the ReSource Data Protection Policy 'We will not keep personal data longer than is necessary for the purpose or purposes for which they were collected. We will take all reasonable steps to destroy, or erase from our systems, all data which is no longer required'

Specifically, we retain financial information i.e. gift aid declarations, donations, payments and associated paperwork for up to 6 years after the calendar year to which they relate.

#### 7. Your rights and your personal data

Unless subject to an exemption under the GDPR, you have the following rights with respect to your personal data: -

- The right to request a copy of your personal data which the ReSource holds about you;
- The right to request that ReSource corrects any personal data if it is found to be inaccurate or out of date;
- The right to request your personal data is erased where it is no longer necessary for ReSource to retain such data;
- Where the lawful basis of our processing of your personal data is consent, the right to withdraw your consent to the processing at any time
- The right to request that we provide you with a copy of the personal data that we hold for you.
- The right, where there is a dispute in relation to the accuracy or processing of your personal data, to request a restriction is placed on further processing;
- The right to lodge a complaint with the Information Commissioners Office.

## 8. Further processing

If we wish to use your personal data for a new purpose, not covered by this Data Privacy Notice, then we will provide you with a new notice explaining this new use prior to commencing the processing and setting out the relevant purposes and processing conditions. Where and whenever necessary, we will seek your prior consent to the new processing before it takes place.
